Termination Policy

"The SEVIS reporting requirements call for a designated school official (DSO) to report (within 21 days) when an individual student fails to maintain status or complete his or her program. The regulations also require schools to report on the status of all F-1 students each term or semester, including any students that have failed to enroll, or who have dropped below a full course of study without prior authorization by the DSO."

A student's record can be terminated for any of the following reasons:

Reasons with adverse consequences for student:

- 1. Unauthorized employment
- 2. Unauthorized withdrawal from classes
- 3. Unauthorized drop below full course of study
- 4. Expulsion and suspension
- 5. Failure to enroll in classes
- 6. Academic dismissal

Reasons with no adverse consequences for student:

- 1. Absent from country for five months or longer (do NOT use on student who is currently in the U.S.)
- 2. Authorized withdrawal from courses (reasons include family emergency, medical emergency, etc.)
